- Complex
  - A large, politically fragmented, cross-border landscape
- Coasta
  - First US National Lakeshore and last US state to join Coastal Zone Management Program
- ECCo location: "place-based"













































"Given the multi-dimensional and dynamic nature of the various challenges and opportunities that have been addressed, comprehensive, cross-jurisdictional planning is essential."
